BRIOLETTE

At the time Briolette was being designed, the Kohler U.S. design team was still exploring the potential of their newly established glass studio. They were still discovering the possibilities and limitations of the glass itself, so the window of opportunity was fairly wide open.

Turning to a variety of inspiration points, the lead designer began by that showcased the true beauty of studying faceted glass forms, from antique decorative crystal and cut diamonds to modern architecture. Drawn to the highly contemporary structure of the Beijing National Aquatic Stadium, she eventually narrowed her focus to working with the hexagonal shape that gives Briolette its distinctive design.


The small team of designers and glass artisans experimented with prototypes of spun glass molds, playing with the scale and repetition edges of Briolette were a direct


of the hexagon to find a balance the material. While the glass studio works with cast, pressed and slumped glass as well, spun glass was used to achieve the incredible depth of dimension in the facets while still preserving the function of a smooth interior surface.

One of the benefits of the small glass studio is the collaboration that occurs between the designers to include four distinctive and the glassmakers themselves during prototyping. The scalloped
















We set out to take the very best of what the Artist Editions. collection stands for and tap into the craft-forward movement at the forefront of design.

After a broad initial exploration of studio pottery and the methods used, we narrowed our efforts to working with rutile glaze, a highly unpredictable artisan glaze that creates a dimensional effect as it rakes over a surface. Ironically, what the studio to manufacturing was makes rutile glaze so difficult to work with is also what makes it so appealing. The way the fired glaze shifts across the ceramic creates a unique depth of color. When water pours over the pattern, its reflective without pooling; and casting a new qualities highlight the subtle tonal differences even further.

with the craftsman glazes of the American Arts & Crafts movement goals, creating a repeatable glazing process that could be scaled from no small feat. The challenge was three-fold: developing a glaze with the right flow consistency; carving the scoops to a pitch and depth that would allow water to drain freely basin shape to achieve a graceful lift from the countertop.






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

As we developed designs to build out our contemporary collections, we saw opportunity to push the material limitations of ceramic. Rectilinear shapes are by far the most difficult to produce consistently in vitreous china, so achieving the long, straight lines that characterize modern design became the primary challenge in creating the Rêve collection.

Our exploration began with the signature 100 cm vanity top and accompanying cabinet. Eliminating not be flush with the cabinet, we ornamentation and purely decorative added a recessed base along the elements, we drew on the minimalism and utilitarian essentialism of Bauhaus design. This focus on function led us in turn to expand the basin to the entire area of the vanity top, increasing the usable space of the sink and redefining the relationship between the basin essentials, extending lines and and functional deck area. The functional deck area became instead an island within the basin, set off by deep v-shaped channels at the back edge of the sink.

To resolve concerns that, given its length, the edge of the vanity top may sink to create a uniform, visually arresting gap where the two connect.


At its heart, the Rêve collection is a celebration of the simple beauty found in clean lines. We pared individual pieces down to their seamless surfaces to accentuate the sculptural geometry and purity of each piece.



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Through conversations with our architect and design partners we discovered a particular need for a family of vessel sinks that felt equally contemporary and approachable.


With this goal in mind, the Shanghai design studio began exploring clean, ceramic designs that could complement a wide range of design aesthetics.


The convention at the time and the work of our competitors featured thick-walled blocky vessels. We believed the time was right to consider a more gracious approach, uniformly tall exterior surfaces and one that spoke to elevated quality and value. Following this line of thinking, the team pursued a series


of basin shapes with a noticeably slim and refined rim instead, working with the sharpest radius possible.

We were after the artful elegance of intricate porcelain sculpture, but in an elemental, geometric form. To achieve this precise, small radius by the detail and integration of along with easy installation, we created a subtle sloping basin with a flat bottom that rests on top of the counter.

Since this was a wholly new approach to ceramic vessel design, we took the opportunity to rethink the overflow as well - incorporating it as an element of design as opposed to a necessity of regulation. The final overflow design was inspired a car door handle and its seamless integration of function. The resulting series of Vox Vessel sinks are pure and delicate shapes that blend beautifully with their surrounding decor.













